Global Media and Information Literacy Week 2023

"Media and Information Literacy in Digital Spaces" is the theme of the 12th edition of Global Media and Information Literacy Week co-organized by UNESCO and the Government of The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan on 23 – 25 October, in a hybrid format. Global Conference on Universal Access to Information 2023

This year's International Day for Universal Access to Information celebrated in Oxford, 28 September 2023, will focus on the importance of online space. The High-level roundtable will discuss access to information and internet disruptions in the context of the Vienna Declaration. A series of three panels will focus on internet accessibility and connectivity; the role of governments, judiciary and information commissioners in securing the proper functioning of internet as an enabler of human rights; the need for international cooperation in the field of strengthening access to information for human rights and achievement of the Goals of Agenda 2030. Mediajungle: Super Fake Safari, submitted by Niels Bloembergen, The Netherlands, is the winner of the MEDEA Award 2023, as announced in 15th MEDEA Awards Ceremony celebrated during Media & Learning Conference 2023: Where pedagogy meets media. Mediajungle is a digital media literacy multimedia game, an innovative combination of a physical puzzle and an app through which players learn interactively about four different forms of disinformation. Both the Special Jury and Audience Favourite Prize were awarded this year to Stolpersteine NRW, submitted by the Westdeutscher Rundfunk, Germany, that provides via an app and browser an innovative approach to the topic of National Socialism. Open-source, free, multi-user, multilingual, sustainable, used without an internet connection, Open Hospital has now additional features and a new patient portal to respond more appropriately to the needs of the hospitals, health centers and facilities in low/middle-income countries. The updated version of the hospital management software, outcome of the Innovation for Development program of the Cariplo Foundation and the Compagnia di San Paolo Foundation, is freely downloadable online. Collective Learning through Antiracist Productions

Karpos, Center of Education and Intercultural Communication, is partner of the European project CLAP (Collective Learning through Antiracist Productions), that aims through MIL practices to create short films against racism. The idea is to train trainers that work with vulnerable groups and give them the tools to create short films with their groups. Over 250 educators will participate in the trainings and at least 300 participants will produce their own audiovisual materials through the trainings.
